Active ethics in play

Active ethics is an accepted part of bridge, valued by bridge players worldwide. In the youth sphere it is recognised by the Joan Gerard Awards.

The WBF revived the award in 2013 to honour the memory of Joan Gerard, a tireless youth bridge proponent. The award is aimed at rewarding aptitude, fair play, sportsmanship and a friendly international spirit, rejecting any discrimination.

The Australian Under 26 Youth Team at the World Youth Championships in Opatija earned the award this year, after their fairness in bringing to the attention a scoring error in their match against Japan, which resulted in a four-board playoff for the right to progress to the semi final.

It was heart-warming then to be told of the active ethics displayed by Duncan Badley – Paula Boughey in their NZ Teams qualifying match against JOHNSTON.

In Round 8, Brad was sitting North when this minor auction accident occurred:

Brad's partner assumed he had raised her spades, so went to pass, then after a moment's pause, saw to her horror that he had made a cue raise. Duncan Badley, in the West seat said immediately "take your pass back", and she gratefully retreated to 3♠.

It was good to see that both teams made it to the round of 16.

Likewise, in the first match of the round of 16, Matt Brown in the South seat, watched Christchurch player, Mehboob Chira unblocking madly with ♣10854 opposite ♣AKQ732 so that he could be in the long club hand on the fourth round, playing a notrump contract.

However, he said "low club" with these clubs remaining: ♣4 opposite ♣732, and would have been stuck in his hand at this point of the hand. Matt said immediately, "No, play the seven", so Mehboob was able to cash his remaining club tricks. Mehboob is one of the most polite and friendly players in Canterbury, so I admire Matt's generosity.

After Chris passed, I opened a full-blooded 3♥. Your bid with the North hand?

Keiran tried 3NT!

Jenna, sitting East, had to decide who she believed - Keiran having a heart stopper, or me preempting in second seat on a jack-high (or less) suit.

Despite me saying many times I believe second seat preempts should be sensible, she went for the latter and "saved" in 4♥. That was doubled, and although I could have gone two down, I ruffed a spade back to hand at the wrong moment and ended up -500.

Assuming Chris would have passed 3NT, we could have cashed six hearts and had a quiet +100. But -500 was still a 3 IMP gain when teammates did well to bid to 5♦. Their auction was:

NZ Teams round of 16

The format for the continuation of the NZ Teams is 3 x 12-board matches on Thursday, while the Multiple Teams, this year a field of 48, the Seniors Teams, 36, and the Intermediate Teams, 26, run in the main playing area (the final rounds of the NZ Teams are traditionally held in the little-used second restaurant). The quarter finals, eight teams, commence on Thursday afternoon.

For a change, I watched an entire match (kibitzing is not my favourite pasttime).

I watched Michael Ware – Matt Brown of the all-Auckland BACH team (with Ashley Bach – Mike Cornell and Tom Jacob – Brian Mace, the leaders of the qualifying) take on Cantabrians MORRISON, Max Morrison – Pavla Fenwick, Mehboob Chira – Richard Laphorne.

I have played with both Pavla and Max, so I wished them well in this tough challenge.

As my start point was Board 10, it looked as if MORRISON had made a good start. Matt, South was in 6♣. Here are the two hands I could see:

I could see the problem in the club suit, so wondered whether Matt would pick up the inference of Mehboob playing ♣J on the first round of clubs from dummy, after a heart lead.

Winning a top club, a second round leads to defeat, but with a surfeit of winners outside clubs, a suspicious declarer can embark upon a plan of shortening the South hand's trumps, leading to a three-card ending, with the lead in dummy:

In fact, 6♣ one down was a loss, as declarer was in 7NT, down two at the other table. 8 declarers were in making slams (mainly 6NT), while two were only in game, and 6 failed in slams.

Michael and Matt applied pressure to the EW pair throughout the match:

Michael made a full-blooded leap to 5♣ over Richard's 1♠ opening, giving Mehboob a problem. He had the choice of doubling for penalty or competing to 5♠. He chose the latter option, only to be doubled.

Michael led ♣A, ruffed, and Richard, suspecting a 5-0 spade break, thought long and hard about his play at trick two.

A line of play like ♦A, felling Matt's ♦Q, and a heart to the nine would have worked, but Richard played a heart to the king at trick two, and now

there was no way home. 4♠ was undisturbed at the other table, so this meant 13 IMPs out.

Even the humorous board where Michael was sevens down in a freely bid 3NT was a loss:

Richard's choice of action did not work out well when Mehboob, at unfavourable vulnerability, did not feel inclined to enter the auction. 2♦, Michaels might have worked better, but as it was, perhaps Mehboob could have essayed 4♥ over 3NT, given Richard's strong bidding.

On a spade lead, Richard took the first five tricks then switched hopefully to ♥Q, covered by the

king and ace, so the defence won the next six tricks.

Michael and Matt, seasoned veterans, were likely to bid 5 of a minor over 4♥, so the +650 EW recorded at the other table was unlikely to be duplicated. + 350! was 7 IMPs to BACH.

A well judged sequence to slam resulted in a 13 IMP swing:

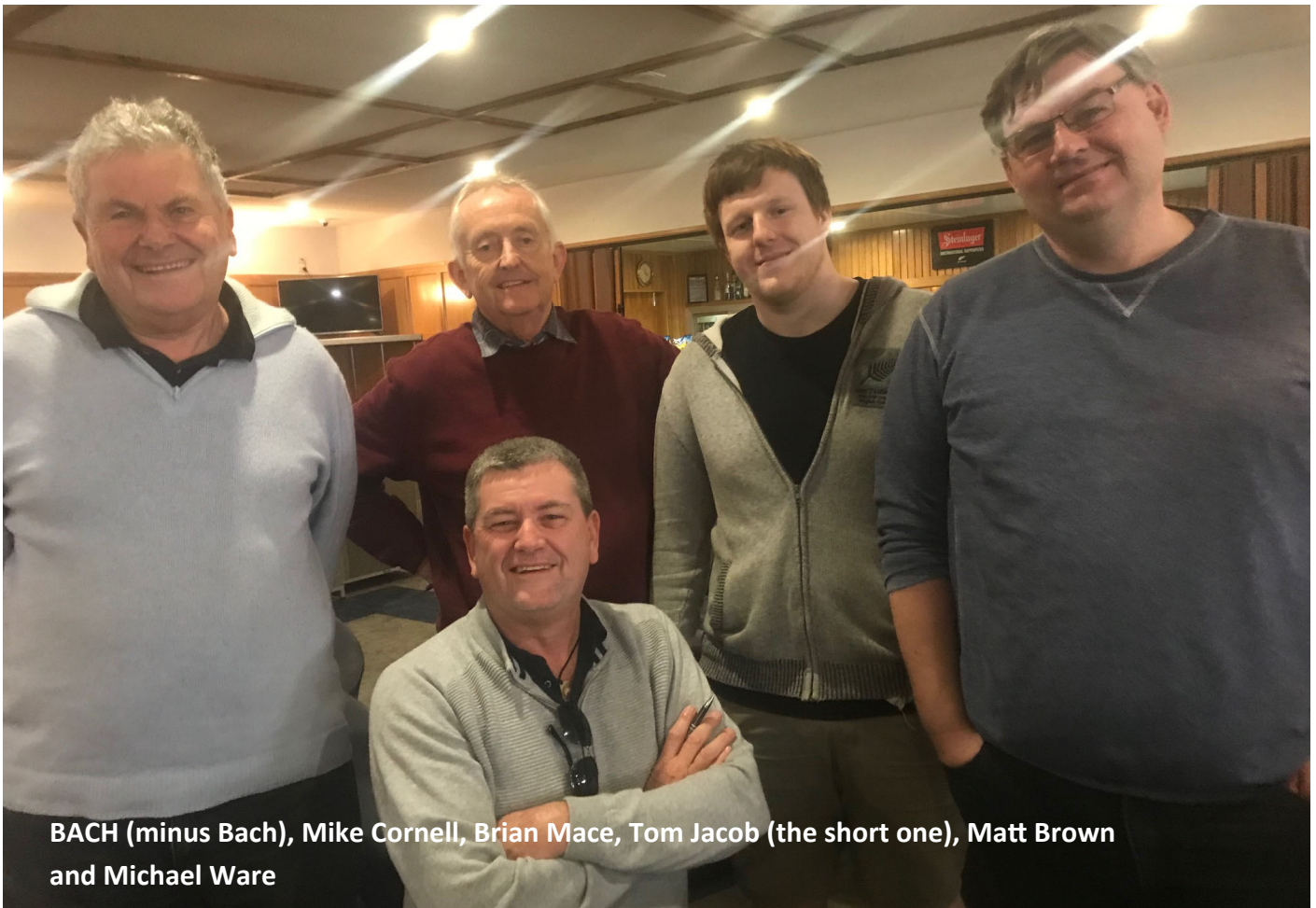

Michael’s first double was negative, and when Matt showed a strong hand with at least 4-5 in diamonds and clubs, the simple jump to 5♣, showing a limited hand, was music to Matt’s ears. On ♠J lead, 13 tricks were easy. 10 of the NS pairs bid slam (with one adjusted score).


MORRISON knew they were facing a giant uphill battle taking on the giants of NZ bridge, but fought on valiantly, in fact winning one stanza.

The match was fought in great spirits, and tomorrow I have another active ethics hand to reveal, reported by opponent Richard Lapthorne, where Matt Brown was again the hero.

This hand caught my interest as a great defensive problem for the defenders. Most tables were in spade contracts.

A heart lead is required to defeat 4♠ by North, as on any other lead, West can be endplayed into surrendering a 10th trick. At the table where I was watching, Michael received ♣8 lead, ducked, so he drew trumps in three rounds, Richard throwing a diamond) and played ♦Q, K, A.

A diamond to hand was followed by a club to the queen and ace.

Richard exited a diamond, so Michael ruffed, played a club to the jack, and when Mehboob showed out, Richard was thrown in with ♣10 to be endplayed in hearts.

If, however, Richard had thrown ♥10 on the third round of spades (instead of a diamond), he would have had a diamond exit. Michael, however, could counter that by cashing his last trump, squeezing Richard out of an exit card.

A fascinating defensive hand, in which the defence prevailed at the other table. To defeat 4♠ by North, the defence has to be sharp to prevail. A heart to West, followed by a low club defeats the game—in effect, West is hoping East either has ♣K or a doubleton club.

Declarer cannot seek a heart ruff else East will get a club ruff, and declarer cannot take advantage of


the extra club trick, as ♣A has been withheld at trick two, and West can cash two more hearts if trumps are drawn.

Transfer responses to 1♣ would see South declarer in 4♠, yet another plus for the transfer system, as 10 tricks are legitimately possible from the South seat only.

Paula saves the day by Eileen Horsman

Teamie Paula Boughey saved our bacon when she bid and made 6♠ in the qualifying.

We had gone for a costly –1100 save in 5♦x on the NS cards so were worried.

Paula, in 6♠ from the East seat, realized that she needed a diamond ruff to make 12 tricks in spades. She planned on making five club tricks, one heart, four spades in hand and two ruffs in dummy.

After winning ♥A, discarding a diamond from hand, she cashed two top clubs and ruffed a club when South discarded.

North rose ♦K on ♦10 and exited a spade. Paula won in hand and ruffed a diamond, cashed the other top spade and ruffed a heart to hand, claiming when trumps were 3-2.

Paula was one of three pairs making slam; 8 IMPs in even with our –1100.

A minor win on a board which should have been HUGE!
