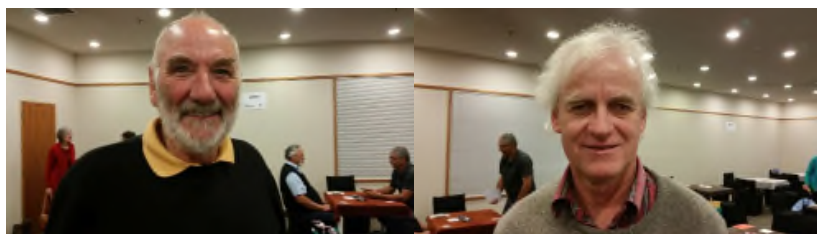

Herve Cheval and Gilles Josnin are two names you may have noticed at tournaments in the Pacific region. The pair from Nouvelle-Calédonie played the 2015 APBF in Thailand and qualified for the A Final at the Gold Coast Pairs earlier this year. Herve showcased his technique on this hand from the first session of Pairs qualifying.

After a deceptive auction where South concealed his spades, West, Tom Jacob, was expecting a juicy penalty. He led the ♣A, saw his partner's suit preference card, and switched to a spade to the ♠Q, ♠K and ♠A. The ♦A revealed the bad break, after which the ♦10 was passed through West. After crossing to dummy with the ♦Q, South had to find a safe way of returning to his hand to draw the last trump. Both black suits would fail, but Herve navigated the position safely, exiting dummy with the ♥Q. With both top heart honours in West, there was no way to promote the ♦J. Well played, Herve.

Tom would be wise to respect his opponents next time. An Ace-King, an Ace, and a possible trump trick is clearly not enough to set a five level contract opposite a Brian Mace four level rebid!

Peter Busch battling the anomalies

Peter's programme Compscore Two has an anomalies checker. Essentially it flags situations where a wrong button may have been pushed.

It flags:

- *Extreme results eg going off more than 7 tricks.*
- *Bidding games with too few points (15 for game, 19 for slam).*
- *Playing in a misfit (less than 6 cards).*
- *Any redoubled contracts.*
- *Any boards where EW and NS are declaring in the same strain.*
- *Tables where the same opening lead appears frequently.*

 On Board 16 - Prs 7 vs 6 are in a slam contract (6SX-N) with 18HCPs (NZ Pairs Semi-Final Session 1 - Green A (25-Sep-16))
 On Board 12 - NS and EW are both playing in Heart contracts beyond the 2 level (NZ Pairs Semi-Final Session 1 - Green A (25-Sep-16))

In this example you can see an anomaly on Board 12 gets flagged 3 times (misfit, few points, and NS playing the same denomination as EW).

Peter runs the programme during the session to try to pick up errors before the round ends. It is so important for instance in a Swiss event to clear up errors before the next draw.

Commenting on the Youth event with a vast range of bridge experience, Peter found that the less experienced players are better at putting in the results correctly, even with those crazy redoubles.

Only a dozen instances occurred in our first day. Nonetheless those who would have been disadvantaged are no doubt grateful for the checks. Yes it can be a big deal but with those who work quietly alongside ensure players get the fairest playing conditions possible.

What are your options here?

Really at any form of scoring to reopen vulnerable with the East hand risks terrible consequences.

On this hand East-West can make a comfortable 3♣. But too many bad things could result from reopening.

- Allow your opponents to find a spade fit.
- Encourage partner to try for a No Trump game
- Encourage partner to compete in without a spade fit.

Ironically it may be safer to reopen here.

Unusually EW (Kieran Crowe-Mai and Bob Sebesfi) don't have an opening bid to show a major/minor two suiter.

So after initially passing Kieran was able to back into the auction with 4♥ at adverse vulnerability, implicitly showing this sort of hand.

This board also featured when Liam Milne and Nye Griffiths bought the contract in 4♠...

The adverse vulnerability did enough to scare East/West out of competing to the five level, so Liam Milne and Nye Griffiths were guaranteed a good score for playing 4♠ undoubled. The heart lead was won by the ♥A for a club pitch. Three rounds of trumps were followed by the ♦3 to the ♦Q. Dummy's ♥4 was ruffed in hand, and a fourth round of trumps saw a fatal diamond discard from East. Now the ♦5 was ducked to the ♦10 and ♦6, another heart was trumped in hand, and the ♦K was lost to the ♦A and, of course, dummy's ♦8. At trick 11, another heart saw Liam pitch his losing club so that he could ruff trick 12. And for trick 13? The ♦7 and a beer, thanks. Liam had turned his good score (-50) into a great score (+420) and in the process earned himself a tasty beverage.

1♦ was Precision. Some players might double with the North hand. But without four cards in either major it is reasonable to pass.

On this hand a double from North would lead to a juicy penalty for N/S but once he passes, this opportunity is lost.

On some hands South might prefer to pass 1♦ and let EW play in this misfit, but here the risk of missing game is too great and +250 is not good enough. A reopening 1NT shows an 11-14 count hand, so here the only option is to double intending to bid 1NT if partner bids either major.

Now North has a problem, jumping to 3♣ would show a weaker hand with a better club suit, jump bidding to 2NT would be right for values but the diamond stop may not be enough, and often the no trumps will play better from the South hand.

(Note that a psychic 1NT response from East may make the auction difficult for N/S. When you hold a near-Yarborough opposite a limited opening, try to stop the opponents bidding their easy game!)
