West's 2 NT shows both minors, Michaels style. East can anticipate that South is about to bid 4 ♥ and that 5 of a minor will be a good sacrifice. Hence, East jumps to 5 ♣ giving South a very difficult decision. The winning action, as long as they start with ♦ A is to pass or double 5 ♣, down one only on that lead. South is more likely to bid 5 ♥, a contract which should always be one down.

West has values and shape, which is more suitable for playing the hand. Thanks to a successful heart finesse, West is correct. 4 ♠ x has 6 losers, only +500 against 650 for making 5 ♥

A club ruff beats 5 ♥ and shows why "the 5 level belongs to the opposition". NS have done well to push their opponents to the 5 level. 5 ♠ has three losers.

South's jump to 3 ♠ is a pre-emptive bid. West's 4 ♥ may end the auction as North has limited values. However, North bids 4 ♠ which West should double. Note:

East leaves the decision over 4 ♠ to their partner, the player in their partnership who bid game. West's hand is too balanced to bid to the 5-level. East-West can make 4 ♥ while North-South should be just one down doubled in 4 ♠.

With a known 10-card fit, South should jump to the spade game but should defend at the 5 level, after West judges to compete to 5 ♥, a very reasonable, but wrong action on the hand.

North will take no further action as they described their hand with their 2 ♠ jump. 5 ♥ should be defeated with a club switch after a spade lead.
