## Health and Safety considerations - a check list to get you started

## Introduction

Keeping members safe will be a priority for all clubs. In this time of Covid-19 and changing lockdown levels, there are a number of factors that each club will have to consider when beginning and continuing club play as public health requirements change, and assess your own clubs risk profile.

Attached is a check list of things to think about, but the first place to look is <u>https://covid19.govt.nz/alert-levels-and-updates/</u> to see what current requirements sit around each Alert Level. Delta variant is transmitted via air, rather than through surfaces, so although sanitation is still really important the ventilation of indoor environments now needs to be added to a check list of things to consider.

If you think your club may be able to open, the following is a prompt list of things to consider. There may be others prompts you think of, or solutions you come up with, that are worth sharing with others. Let NZ Bridge know so we can pool our resources and get back to playing bridge as soon as we can.

## CONTACT TRACING:

Contact tracing is the identification of individuals that have come in contact with people who may have been exposed to a disease. It is a fundamental precaution against the spread of disease in the community. It should be offered for those unable to scan in using QR codes.

- 1. At a minimum be prepared to collect:
  - a. Date
  - b. Time
  - c. Full name
  - d. Address
  - e. Phone
  - f. Email

- 2. Be prepared to keep the information for at least 4 weeks but the Ministry of Health (or other government department) will advise this information
- 3. Be prepared to keep the information private and secure.
- 4. Be prepared to securely dispose the information completely and thoroughly. It must at a minimum be shredded.
- 5. Individuals must be made aware of the reason for the register, and what will happen to the information.
- 6. Nominate a person responsible for the collection and maintenance of the data. Should there be a suspected case of the disease from someone who visited your facility, this person should be responsible for contacting the Ministry (through a hot line). It will be the Ministry's responsibility to decide on necessary follow-up.
