
A relaxed start to the NZ Congress, with a leisurely 10:30am start (a reminder here that Daylight Savings kicks in on Sunday morning, so an hour less sleep as well as a 9:30 am start tomorrow!)

Two sections of 13 table Mitchells and a 23-table section catered for the 96 pairs entered for the NZ Open Pairs. The NZ Open Pairs was a two-board affair while the Restricted Open Pairs played a 28 table three board movement.

I watched from behind the South seat, with Ashley Bach South and Michael Cornell North.

Ashley and Michael defended well on the following deal, where EW could make eight tricks in the 5-3 heart fit or nine in the 4-4 spade fit.






Bach led a diamond, declarer winning the ace in dummy and playing ♣Q. Bach won the ace, and continued a diamond to declarer's king.

He played a heart to the queen and ace. He now erred by playing a second heart without taking a heart discard on •Q. Cornell won and cashed another heart as Bach shed a diamond.

A fourth round of hearts saw declarer ruff with ♠Q as Bach discarded his last diamond. Declarer took the losing ruffing finesse of ♣J, and now with the defenders' trumps high apart from ♠K, a crossruff ensued, with down four earning the NS pair a 100% score.



Ashley did not enjoy this hand one little bit. He led ♣3, and Ellen Curnow made short work of the play. Putting in ♣10 from dummy is recommended, but when she played ♣4, it went ♣3, ♣4, ♣5, ♣K!

◆Q was covered by the king and the ace, and now Ellen ran ◆9. When that won, she cashed out the rest of the diamond suit, putting Ashley under intense discarding pressure. When he unguarded hearts, Ellen scored 13 tricks for 94 matchpoints (only 2 for Ashley and Michael).





This board created problems for many pairs.

Cornell - Bach defended 3NT after a strong notrump by West and 2♣, majors from Cornell.

EW can hold declarer to seven tricks, but after ♣J opening lead, declarer managed to score a heart trick to go with the six diamond tricks and a club trick (declarer played low from dummy and won the king in hand. This was 61 matchpoints (out of 96) to NS.

At least one auction started 1NT: 2♣, 2♠, all pass, with declarer making eight tricks (supposedly the









limit, but in reality some EW pairs bid and made 3NT, or nine tricks in diamonds.


The biggest score was from 2♥X by NS, making for +470. Peer Bach - Setsuko Lichtnecker were the only NS pair to find the par spot, 4♣, making +130 for 94 matchpoints.

What do you bid with ♠AJ54, ♥Q9763, ♦J4, ♣A6 after partner opens 1♣ and RHO bids 1♠, alerted and explained as diamonds or the majors?

It is probable from your hand that RHO has the diamond option. Should we bid 2, forcing? Our hearts are not great, and that makes it difficult to find spades as a strain.

David Hangartner tried the effect of double. Mark Hangartner rebid 2♣, giving David another problem. He now bid 2♥ and heard 2♠ from Mark. He raised ro 3♠ and there the auction finished.

Mark made 9 tricks in spades, scoring 80 matchpoints for the making partscore. The nebulous 1♠ bid didn't work this time, so David's efforts to explore the best spot worked out well.



With hearts breaking 3-3 and the spade suit behaving perfectly, 10 tricks are possible on any defence.

The following deal poses a difficult problem for a matchpoint declarer. Should one play safely, or try to grab the maximum number of tricks assuming things are going to go as normal.

Several declarers made 10 tricks in hearts, and John Goacher's invention *Bridge Solver Online* affirms this is true.

A winning line is to duck ♣A, win the second club, cross to ♠A, ruff a club then shed two diamond losers on ♠KQ.

A heart to hand clears up the trump position, and declarer's aim of losing two trump tricks and a club is achieved.

Bach's line of winning the first club, cashing ♠A and discarding clubs on ♠KQ was thwarted when he tried to cross back to hand in diamonds and West, Liam Milne was able to ruff ♠K and score three heart tricks and a club.


What do you lead from ♠98764, ♥--, ♦K9732, ♠K84 after this sequence?

This has been a Kokish-style auction, with South showing a strong hand with hearts and clubs. North has taken control with 4NT and bid 6♦ after South shows 3 Key Cards for hearts.

A number of NS pairs bid confidently to slam and avoided the killing diamond lead. I was always told that leading away from a king had the upside of finding partner with either the ace or queen of the suit. Here South is likely to be short in diamonds, having shown hearts and clubs.

There were slightly more pairs going down in 6♥ than making. The full hand:


