
Bridge Solver. This, however scored only 24 matchpoints EW, while **Kate Davies** scored 33 matchpoints for going two down in 3♠.











Young Te Puke player Marcus Dudley, in partnership here with Johnny Davidson made the normal action of overcalling 1NT, which ended the auction.

Lloyd led ♥J, perhaps not the normal choice from her hand. Grosvenor gave count with ♥2 and Dudley won with the ace. He tried a tricky low spade from hand.

Lloyd, not to be tricked, won with ♠9 and continued with sVintage Mayer

pades, cashing out the suit. A switch back to hearts put Dudley in, and now when he played Lloyd for ◆Q, Grosvenor was able to cash his heart tricks for one down.

Dudley only needs three diamond tricks for his contract, but got himself to a point where he could no longer afford to lose a diamond, whereas

earlier in the play, when he still held a second heart stopper, it would have been safe to do so.

Lloyd led ♣Q, and Malcolm Mayer, one of New Zealand's finest declarer players, fresh from reprssenting New Zealand at Marrakesh, contemplated the play.

He won the lead in hand and played a low spade to the nine, jack and Grosvenor's king. Grosvenor switched to ◆2, and won Lloyd's jack with the ace.

Reading the situation perfectly, Mayer played a heart to the king in hand, followed by a heart to the queen and ace. ♠A, dropping Lloyd's queen, and a diamond to the 10 was followed by a club to the king and dummy's ♠8, on which Mayer threw ♠Q.







He now claimed 12 tricks on a high crossruff, leacing Grosvenor and Lloyd with zero matchpoints.

## Just a thought

One of the gadgets a number or players have in their toolbox is the fragment-showing 3 major bid over a 1NT opening.

So 1NT 3♥ shows a 1354 or 1345 shape with game values, and 1NT 3♠ shows a 3154 or 3145 shape. You can play it the other way where bidding 3 major shows a shortage but the same minors message.

Easy to diagnose that 3NT may not be the best place to play after a 1NT 3♠ start to the auction on the hand above.

## Honorary Life Membership – Richard Solomon and Jenny Wilkinson

## **Richard Solomon**

Richard has been involved in NZ Bridge administration for 38 years. He started on the Editorial Committee of NZ Bridge Magazine, and he retired from his full-time role at NZ Bridge on 31 December 2022.

Richard is a Gold Grand Master, and has represented NZ in the Open Team, but his major contribution to NZ Bridge has been as a key driver in a number of initiatives, Committees and events including: -

- Congress Committee (from early 1990s)
- NZ Bridge Magazine (Editorial Committee / June 1984 & Editor from Feb 1991)
- Major Events including NZ Wide Pairs (from

1998) and coordinating the national Dan Gifford Rubber Bridge competition.

- Youth & Teaching Committees including organising the annual Youth Weekend.
- Many Club and Regional Committees including the Auckland region, Akarana, Franklin and currently Te Aroha.
- International Representative and NPC

Even since retirement at the end of 2022, Richard has continued to contribute to the Congress Committee, has organised the Loveblock NZ Wide Pairs and writes for the Bridge Playing Community a daily column on hands and notable events.









Richard continues to give his time to assist Clubs in teaching and Improver Sessions around the country. He has taken Beginner Lessons in Morrinsville, Improver Sessions in Thames and delivered Zoom & *Realbridge* training to the Balclutha Club.

Richard will say that he has been lucky to be paid to do something he is passionate about and will continue to be an integral part of the NZ Bridge Community.

## **Jenny Wilkinson**

Jenny comes from a card playing family, and joined the Christchurch Bridge Club on 21 August 1974 after friends introduced her to Bridge. Although her four children were very young at the time she joined this did not stop her playing twice a week at the club and in as many tournaments as was possible. Her love for bridge became more of a passion.

Jenny is a Silver Grand Master and has represented New Zealand in the NZ Women's Team 28 times from 1985 until 2021, playing firstly with Tina McVeigh and for 21-one years with Shirley Newton.

Jenny spent several years on the Christchurch Bridge Club Committee, as a member and as Vice President. She started teaching Beginner and Improver Bridge Lessons in the 1980's and taught for around thirty years. Her enthusiasm for Bridge has always been obvious and something she has always attempted to pass onto others. She was made a Life Member of the Christchurch Bridge Club in 2021.

Jenny served as a member of the Canterbury Bridge Centre (now the Canterbury Regional Committee) for eight or nine years. She also served on the NZCBA Management Committee (replaced in 2008 by the NZ Bridge Board) for two terms of three years, chairing the International Subcommittee during that time.

Jenny was part of the NZ Bridge Teaching Subcommittee during the ten years it was active and contributed to developing the Beginner and Improver Lesson Material that is currently on the Website. She has continued to teach and supervise beginners in a range of settings until recently.

Jenny has acted as the Recorder, both at the Christchurch Bridge Club and for the Canterbury Region for some twenty years.

Never one to seek the limelight, Jenny has been a tireless advocate and supporter of Bridge for almost fifty years and has contributed admirably to the various Bridge Committees she has served on.
